This class will explore concepts typically covered through the first quarter of algebra including: properties and operations with real numbers, solving equations and inequalities, graphing equations, and solving systems of equations.

GATEWAY TO PRE- ALGEBRA

Grades: 5-7

Examples of concepts to be covered include basic operations with decimals, fractions, percents, integers, and rational numbers; properties of real numbers; number theory; evaluating expressions; and graphing.
